# LUKE – An Introduction

## *LOST AND FOUND*

“For the Son of man came to seek and to save what was lost.”

Luke 19:10

Luke is one of the four gospels of the New Testament that tells about the life of Jesus. It is generally regarded as a literary masterpiece, since it contains some of the finest Greek writing in the New Testament. The book is written to the “most excellent Theophilus”, whose name means “lover of God”, and whose title suggests that he was a high official in the Roman government. Many scholars believe that Luke was probably written around 58-62 AD from Caesarea; however, the dating is controversial.

Although the writer is not named specifically, much evidence points to Luke, a man mentioned by name only three times in the entire New Testament. Luke was probably a Greek, and is the only Gentile writer of the New Testament books. Some believe he had been a slave who was given his freedom. Legend says that Luke was a painter, which explains his beautiful descriptive character portrayals. Luke wrote the book of Acts, a sequel to his writing about Jesus, and tells about the establishment of the church. The writer of these two books contributed more words to the New Testament than any other author. Luke was a companion with Paul on missionary journeys (as described in the “we” sections of Acts). Paul calls him a “dear friend” and a “doctor” in Colossians 4:14, and a “fellow worker” in Philemon 24. Luke was with Paul near the end of his life, according to II Timothy 4:11, and many believe that Luke was Paul’s personal physician, who began to sail with Paul from Troas on the second missionary journey.

Luke’s Gentile background helps explain his theme throughout the book that Jesus offers salvation to ALL men. The genealogy of Christ goes back to Adam, the father of mankind, rather than Abraham, the father of Israel (as found in the gospel of Matthew). He dates events by Roman governors, seldom quotes the Old Testament, gives Greek equivalents of Hebrew words, and is the easiest of the four gospels to read for a person without a Jewish background. The artistic symbol for the book of Luke is a calf – a sacrificial animal – that focuses on Jesus being the sacrifice for everyone in the world, whether Jew or Gentile, male or female, saint or sinner.

Being a physician gives great significance to the gospel, since Luke would have known research methods and could accurately record information. His sources probably included material from Matthew, information from Paul, and interviews with Mary the mother of Jesus and other followers. He gives the fullest account of the birth of Jesus, and the ONLY account of the boyhood trip to the temple at age 12. There is a great emphasis on healings of Jesus, and many details given in the stories that a doctor would notice and record. He records five of the seven healings that Jesus performed on the Sabbath.

Luke includes elements of song –Mary, Zechariah, the angels, and Simeon being examples in the opening chapters. The phrase “praising God” occurs more in Luke than in the rest of the New Testament combined. He also speaks of prayer, and the Holy Spirit.

Luke’s method of telling about Jesus focuses on stories of individuals who met Jesus. There is an unusual prominence given to women, possibly due to his Greek background and the different place women had in the Greek culture. He mentions Mary, Elizabeth, Anna, the widow of Nain, Mary Magdala, Mary and Martha, the widow with two coins, the cripple woman, the ones who gave of their means to support Jesus, and the “daughters of Jerusalem”. Luke tells of Jesus’ generosity to the poor and neglected people in Israel (tax collectors, the prodigal son, the beggar Lazarus, Zacchaeus, the dying criminal, and the Samaritans) while saying how hard it is for the rich to enter the kingdom of God. Luke also tells of homes and families.

One-third of the material in Luke is not found in other gospel accounts: 6 miracles, 18 parables, and a large amount of the teaching of Jesus. It was written to produce or strengthen faith in Christ as savior, not simply as biographical information.

Several commentators referred to Luke as the “most beautiful book”. It is certainly rich feasting for any who read it.
